On Tuesday, August 5th, San Mateo, like many cities on the Peninsula, will participate in National Night Out. This annual national campaign is designed to raise crime prevention awareness, strengthen neighborhood unity and spirit, and develop partnerships between the City and the community.

This has also traditionally been an opportunity for Neighborhood Watch groups to get together, and for those who do not have one in their area to start new Neighborhood Watch groups. ## **ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE**

**The Annual Exterior Audit** letters should be in the mail to affected owners. Please contact PML if you have questions about the findings. Thanks in advance to owners for promptly responding to their audit letter. Please contact PML with questions.

#### **LANDSCAPE**

In addition to standard activities, the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during June/July:

- Removal of trash in common/easement areas each Tuesday
- Replaced three irrigation clocks and increased watering to 3 days per week (which we feel is an appropriate balance between water conservation and saving the landscaping)
- Completed brush clearing in common spaces as part of fire safety program. Fire Dept inspected and approved. City has been billed for their portion of the work.
- Pruned junipers away from sidewalk near 3400 Chris Ln
- Large tree trimming in the common spaces ongoing
- Walk-thru of common areas with landscaper

Important Fire Safety Note - While inspecting the brush clearing work, we found debris blocking some of the easement areas, such as those running between homes or behind homes. These easements were created to allow fire responders access to the canyons behind homes quickly. By leaving debris, nets and play things in the way, it impedes passage. Owners may NOT use easement areas as a dumping or storage area. If you have questions about what is an easement area, please contact PML, and the Board can follow up with you.

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

## TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

**Fire Safety** – This continues to be a high fire danger summer. Our brush-trimming project, completed in June, is only one element of fire safety. Please be diligent about fire safety around your home and in keeping an eye out for signs of trouble in the canyons and on hillsides. Also, this may be a good time to confer with your insurance company to ensure your home's fire damage coverage is up to date.

Mountain Lion Sightings – As no doubt many of you have heard, there were several mountain lion sightings in the last month in San Mateo, both in the Highlands areas as well as near the creek on the other side of Sugarloaf Mountain. It is recommended that you pay special attention to your small children and pets, especially if in yards at night or early morning. Mountain lions are most active at dusk, night time, and dawn.

"See Something / Say Something" – As always, please keep an eye out for behaviors that don't make sense, and call the police as necessary. Better safe than sorry. Use 650-522-7700 for non-emergencies.
