PRESIDENT'S CORNER

De Anza / Parkwood Stop Sign Update — At our last Board meeting, this topic was reviewed, and we received some input from HOA members. After the discussion, the Board decided that we would not appeal the DPW's decision to reject the 4-way stop sign proposal and, instead, eliminate additional parking spaces along De Anza that are blocking visibility to cars turning left onto De Anza from Parkwood in our HOA area. It is our understanding that the City will move forward to eliminate the parking spaces between Parkwood and Amy Drive. We will monitor progress and report back to you. Thanks to the homeowners who came to the meeting or sent comments via email. There were some additional points raised by you, and the Board has captured these concerns for future consideration.

Managing our HOA – It's approaching the end of the year, and that means planning for next year. This includes planning for our Annual HOA Meeting and our Elections process. There will be three Board of Directors positions up for election, with each incumbent having served for several years. Now is the time for "new blood" to join in helping to run our HOA. ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

All exterior architectural changes require approval by the architectural control committee, as per our CC&Rs. This includes re-painting, re-roofing, new garage doors, fences, windows, driveways, adding skylights or solar panels, etc. Also, if you intend to install a **satellite dish or antenna** that will be visible from the outside of the residence, please contact the committee to discuss

placement (see Article 6.03). Please visit our website for lots of useful information and the project form you'll need to submit.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities (e.g., litter removal and routine shrub maintenance), the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during Nov/Dec:

- Drains are being examined and cleared as necessary as part of preparation for *El Nino* rains. Homeowners are encouraged to check drains and gutters on their property to ensure they can perform when needed!
- Common area irrigation systems have been turned off for the winter.

The Landscape budget for 2016 has been approved. It calls for a slight increase, mostly for tree work (4th phase) and irrigation system maintenance.

Resealing of the private streets has been scheduled for early next year, depending on the weather. More on this later.

We remind homeowners of their responsibility to keep front landscape in good appearance. A brown lawn is acceptable; weeds are not. Trees also need to be trimmed. When doing yard work near common area, be aware of our irrigation pipes. Our crew recently had to repair a broken irrigation pipe in an easement area on Toyon. A homeowner's gardener broke the pipe while digging in that area. If in doubt, ask for help! Otherwise, you are responsible for any damage.

Please note the CalWater requirements for outdoor irrigation. See www.calwater.com or your bill. Even addresses Tue/Fri, Odd addresses Mon/Thur, always before 8am or after 6pm.

Leaf Blower Courtesy: Please note that city code restricts leaf blowing to 8am-5pm on Mon-Fri, 9am-5pm on Sat (no leaf blowing on Sundays!). Please have your crews respect the law.

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

TRASH / RECYCLING – PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. Bins may not be stored

anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice. Also, please recall that city code requires **picking up after dogs.** Please keep your dogs off neighbors' front yards and be considerate of others' (including common space) property.

Drains can easily become clogged over time, and I was amazed how much debris (dirt, mud, leaves, roof material runoff) was in most of my gutters. Please take the time to ensure your gutters and drains are performing properly in advance of the expected heavy rains. To not do so risks damage to your property as well as the safety of you, your family, and potentially your neighbors.
