PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Budget Time of Year! – The Board is working hard with PML to finalize the 2018 budget, which will be approved at the November Board meeting. The amount of the annual assessment (dues) will be determined by this analysis of operating expenses and reserve fund needs.

What's on the Board's Mind?

Board Leadership: We are approaching election time for Board members. In January, three director positions will be up for election. Current Board members have served for many years ^(C). It really does not take much of your time to stay engaged and help run our HOA. Please contact me or any Board member to discuss your interest. A short nomination statement is needed to be placed on the annual ballot.

Rental Restrictions: The Board will bring an updated rental restrictions proposal to the membership prior to year's end. The prior proposal received a large majority of votes in favor, but the total number of cast votes was not large enough to approve of the amendment. Please note that the proposed amendment to limit the total number of rental properties allowed within Sugarloaf will **NOT apply to any current owners**. It would only apply to property owners who purchase property after approval of the amendment. We need people to help ensure votes are cast from every neighborhood. Please contact me if you can help.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Architecture:

Thanks to those homeowners who have already responded to their notification of an exterior issue (painting, damaged fences, etc.). The 90-day deadlines have now passed, and the committee will be informing the Board. Please note that fines can be levied is after the deadline passes, per the HOA fine policy. Please do not ignore your notice!

Landscape:

Fire Safety – The wine country fires remind us that we must be prepared! Every June/July, we do the 100 ft defensible fire space (weed abatement) work, and roughly every five years we do the 6 ft tree trimming work, all inspected by the SM Fire Marshal. To make sure we learn from the recent fires, the Landscape Committee is meeting in the next two weeks with the SM Fire Marshal's office to gather their updated recommendations. We will report our findings in the next newsletter.

Large Trees – The new 5-year plan has been completed, and ~300 trees have been identified as needing trimming or removal, which will begin early next year. We will start Phase One of the work on 80 trees after we award the job at the next Board meeting. In

addition, we will also be doing the SMFD 6ft. trim project early next year and follow other SMFD recommendations.

Irrigation – The irrigation has been turned off in the common and easement areas for the winter. If you notice any sprinklers on in these areas, please let PML know.

Drainage – The landscape crew has and will continue to inspect all surface drains in the common and easement areas. Homeowners should also check their drains and gutters for debris and function to prevent flooding or other problems as the rains arrive.

Trim for View – Homeowners have mentioned that the Oak trees have really grown this year and reduced their views. If you want to trim these Oaks in the common areas for views <u>at your</u> <u>expense</u>, here is the procedure:

- 1. Take a picture of the trees to be trimmed.
- 2. Get an estimate from a qualified tree company (must have a certified arborist on staff)
- 3. Submit all the above to Debbie at PML.
- 4. The Landscape Committee will review and determine approvability
- 5. The Homeowner pays for trim for view work.

Please do not trim/cut trees in common areas without approval. Common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are trimmed by the HOA only if a fire hazard.

PLEASE FOLLOW CC&RS AND CITY CODES

Trash/Recycling (subject to fines) -- Please remember, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code), trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. Bins may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice. If your trash does not fit in your trash can, please don't leave it next to the can as they will not be collected. Contact *Recology* to get a bigger trash can.

Visitor Parking (subject to fines) -- We are still receiving complaints of homeowners and renters using the visitor parking spaces as their own private parking. Since there is no room for street parking on the private streets, there are specific areas for visitor parking, whether it is a visitor from out of town or people visiting a home to provide service (landscape, handy work, cleaning). These spaces must be kept available for visitors, per CC&Rs Sec 5.04(a), **subject to fine**.
