PRESIDENT'S CORNER

<u>Finally Getting Some Rain & Snow!</u> — Well, better late than never! March has brought lots of needed rain. We'll take what we can get here and in the Sierra. The return of common area irrigation will be based on weather assessments.

Important San Mateo Issues – There is a lot going on in local government (San Mateo & CA) related to housing & development topics! There is a movement within San Mateo to extend Measure P (controls on development in San Mateo, including height restrictions). This would require a successful petition effort to be included in the 2018 election process. For more info on this topic, see http://smartergrowthsm.com. There are also State Assembly Bills SB-827 & 828 under discussion that would provide developers exemptions to local development restrictions if they propose high density housing in "transit-rich" areas, such as along El Camino in San Mateo. Important HOA Business This Month:

<u>Annual Election</u> – The Annual Election process is ongoing. Ballots were due to PML by March 13! If you've not cast your vote, please do ASAP! Contact PML if you need another ballot. We can't complete the process until we get a quorum of votes, which means we can't perform important HOA activities!

Rental Restrictions - The Board plans to bring an updated rental restrictions amendment to the membership for a vote, and this vote will take place after our annual election process completes. We'll be posting the draft amendment on the web site soon. In the spring, we'll need people to help ensure votes are cast from every neighborhood. Please contact me if you can help.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Architecture:</u> Annual exterior audit coming in May/June. Please make sure to address prior audit findings; fines can be assessed.

<u>Landscape</u>: At the annual meeting, the SMFD gave a presentation on Wildfires and how to prevent, prepare, and cope with one. If you missed it, and many did, it is now available on the Sugarloaf web site. Suggest you take a look, valuable information!

Landscape work completed during February, 2018 -

- Removed dead/declining shrubs in common/ easement areas around Douglas, Westwood, Chris, and Cheryl Ct.
- Removed ivy growing on fences along Chris Lane
- Removed dead tree between 1601 1573 De Anza
- Repaired leaking irrigation valve on Chris Lane

- Removed Pampas grass in common area in back of Toyon Ct.
- Irrigation was turned on 1 day a week for two weeks due to dry conditions during February.

Landscape projects planned for this year (estimated timing):

- Annual 100-foot defensive fire space clearing late June.
- Stage one of new tree study remove 9-10 dead trees in April
- Walk through with SMFD Fire Safety Inspector April
- Annual testing of back-flow prevention valves late March
- Annual testing of irrigation system March/April
- Mandatory 6 ft. ladder trim (every 5-6 years) July
- Wood Chips spread at common/easement areas late spring

Trim for View – Homeowners have mentioned that the Oak trees have really grown this year and reduced their views. If you want to trim these Oaks in the common areas for views <u>at your expense</u>, here is the procedure:

- 1. Take a picture of the trees to be trimmed.
- Get an estimate from a qualified tree company (must have a certified arborist on staff)
- 3. Submit all the above to Debbie at PML.
- 4. The Landscape Committee will review and determine approvability
- 5. The Homeowner pays for trim for view work.

Please do not trim/cut trees in common areas without approval. Common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are trimmed by the HOA only if a fire hazard.

Dog Poop Reminder – You are responsible for picking up after your dog. Please don't leave your dog's poop on common space or private property. You wouldn't like it on your property!

PLEASE FOLLOW CC&RS AND CITY CODES

Trash/Recycling (subject to fines) -- Please remember, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code), trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. Bins may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice. If your trash does not fit in your trash can, please don't leave it next to the can as they will not be collected. Contact *Recology* to get a bigger trash can.

Visitor Parking (subject to fines) -- We are still receiving complaints of homeowners and renters using the visitor parking spaces as their own private parking. Since there is no room for street parking on the private streets, there are specific areas for visitor parking, whether it is a visitor from out of town or people visiting a home to provide service (landscape, handy work, cleaning). These spaces must be kept available for visitors, per CC&Rs Sec 5.04(a), **subject to fine**.
